THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAN FRANCISCO 1853

The Alignment of Utah Territory Within the Archdiocese of San Francisco

When Catholic missionaries first brought Christianity to the American Southwest, the Catholic population for many years was so sparse that it was administered from various dioceses in Old Mexico. By the time of the Mexican War (1846-48), administrative realignments had become necessary for two reasons. First the Catholic population had grown large enough that creation of local dioceses had become advisable. Secondly with the Mexican American War, the acquisition by the United States of the area including the modern states of California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico and part of Colorado, creation of local dioceses had become necessary, so that American parishes and missions would not be administered across national lines.



By 1853, the Holy See had divided the Mexican Cession, as it was called, into two regions. The newly created Archdiocese of San Francisco, extended from the 42nd parallel (the present northern border of California, Nevada, and Utah) south to the 37th parallel (slightly north of Monterey, California). South of the 37th parallel were the Dioceses of Monterey and Santa Fe. Utah Territory, created as part of the Compromise of 1850, was located within the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

In 1866, Utah Catholics were briefly placed under the jurisdiction of the newly created Diocese of Marysville, California (presently the Diocese of Sacramento). Two years later, Utah was moved into the Diocese of Denver, but in 1870 it was returned to the Archdiocese of San Francisco, where it has remained.

As the Catholic population within the former Mexican Cession continued to

grow, eventually nine suffragan dioceses were erected within the Province of San Francisco. Utah was one of those. On November 23, 1886, the Vicariate Apostolic of Utah was established, and on January 27, 1891 it became the Diocese of Salt Lake under its first bishop, the pioneer priest Lawrence Scanlan. A papal decree of 1951 added the word “City” to the name of the diocese, making it the Diocese of Salt Lake City.

Until 1931, when the Diocese of Reno was created, six eastern counties of Nevada were part of the diocese, making the Diocese of Salt Lake geographically the largest diocese in the United States. By comparison, the seven dioceses in the state of New York comprise a total area of 47,246 square miles, which was only about one-third the area of the Diocese of Salt Lake. Even in its reduced size after 1931, Utah is still one of the larger dioceses in the country with it’s nearly 85,000 square miles.

Chronological History of the Diocese of Salt Lake City

1776–September 13 - October 15: Spanish Franciscan missionaries Silvestre de Escalante and Atanazio Dominguez visit Utah.

1850–The Holy See establishes the Diocese of Monterey (restructured in 1853 as the Metropolitan See of San Francisco) with jurisdiction over Utah Territory.

1859–April - October: Father Bonaventure Keller, OMC, serves as chaplain at Camp Floyd in Utah Territory.

1864–September 26: Father Jean Batiste Raverdy, Diocese of Santa Fe, offers Sunday Mass at Camp Douglas, Utah.

1866–May to December: Father Edward Kelly celebrates Mass in Salt Lake and purchases the first Catholic Church property in Utah.

1868–The Holy See places Utah Territory under jurisdiction of the Vicariate of Colorado-Utah for a two-year period.

1871–November 26: The first Catholic church in Utah is dedicated in Salt Lake City under the patronage of Saint Mary Magdalene (Social Hall Avenue).

1873–August 14: Father Lawrence Scanlan arrives in Salt Lake City.

1875–Saint Joseph Parish is established in Ogden. In June The Holy Cross Sisters arrive in Utah. The Holy Cross Sisters construct Saint Mary Academy and open Holy Cross Hospital in Salt Lake City.

1879–Father Scanlan, assisted by the Holy Cross Sisters, opens Saint John Church and Hospital, and Saint Mary School, in Silver Reef, Utah.

1881–Father Scanlan builds Saint Mary of the Assumption Church in Park City and Saint Patrick Church in Frisco.

1885–In Eureka a church named for Saint Patrick is established for the miners of the Tintic District, Juab County, Utah.

1886–November 23: Rome creates the Vicariate of Utah and Eastern Nevada, naming Father Scanlan vicar bishop. The same year the Marist Fathers open All Hallows College for men in Salt Lake City.

1890–Holy Rosary Parish, which will become Immaculate Conception Parish, is established in Bingham Canyon.

1891–January 27: Pope Leo XIII creates the Diocese of Salt Lake. Bishop Scanlan moves into a new rectory beside the cathedral site, establishing Saint Ann Orphanage in his former rectory (Social Hall Avenue).

1892–Saint Patrick Parish opens in Salt Lake City. Bishop Scanlan remodels a Provo residence into a chapel-rectory, which will become Saint Francis of Assisi.

1897–Mount Calvary Catholic Cemetery is opened in Salt Lake City on 19.05 acres of land donated to the diocese by Salt Lake City Corporation.

1899—Groundbreaking for the Cathedral; Intermountain Catholic Newspaper begun; Cornerstone for Saint Ann Orphanage laid.

1909—In Salt Lake City Saint Mary Magdalene Cathedral is dedicated; Judge Mercy Home and Hospital is constructed.

1910—Saint Marguertie Parish in Tooele established.

1913—Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Salt Lake City, established.

1915—**May 10**: Death of Bishop Scanlan. **August 24**: Father Joseph S. Glass, C.M., is named second bishop of the Diocese of Salt Lake.

1916—Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Magna established.

1917—Divine Savior (later Sacred Heart) and Saint Ann parishes in Salt lake City established.

1918—Notre Dame de Lourdes Parish established in Price.

1919—Daughters of Charity come to the Diocese and open “Judge Mercy.” All Hallows College for Men closes.

1920—Bishop Glass renovates the cathedral interior and renames the church The Cathedral of the Madeleine. Judge Memorial Catholic High School formerly the Judge Mercy Home and Hospital, opens.

1922—Saint James the Greater Parish in Vernal, established.

1925—Saint Vincent de Paul Parish in Murray, and Saint Therese of the Child Jesus in Midvale are established.

1926—**January 26**: Death of Bishop Glass. The College of Saint Mary of the Wasatch is opened. **September 8**: Bishop John J. Mitty is appointed third Bishop of Salt Lake.

1928—**April 15**: Notre Dame School opens in Price.

1931—**March 27**: The Holy See detaches Eastern Nevada from the Diocese of Salt Lake, declaring its boundaries the same as those of the State of Utah.

1932—Bishop John J. Mitty transferred to San Francisco as Coadjutor Archbishop. Bishop James E. Kearney appointed fourth Bishop of Salt Lake.

1935—Saint Joseph Parish in Monticello established.

1936—Christ the King Parish in Cedar City established. **November**: The Cathedral of the Madeleine is consecrated.

1937— Bishop Kearney transferred to Rochester, New York. Bishop Duane G. Hunt begins a 23 year tenure during which fourteen parishes are established. He brings the Trappist Monks and Carmelite Sisters to Utah, and the Sister of Charity of the Incarnate Word open St. Joseph Villa, a home for the aged and infirmed.

1939—Saint John Bosco Parish in Delta established.

1940-Saint Helen Parish in Roosevelt established.

1941-Saint Thomas Aquinas Parish in Logan established.

1943-Saint Olaf Parish in Bountiful established.

1944-Saint Anthony of Padua Parish in Helper and Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Salt Lake City are established.

1945-Catholic Charities, later Catholic Community Services, opens.

1946-Benedictine Sisters from Minnesota open Saint Benedict Hospital; Mount Benedict Monastery later build in Ogden.

1947-Saint Elizabeth Parish in Richfield and Good Shepherd Parish, Dragerton (later East Carbon City) are established. Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance (Trappists) arrive in diocese and build Abbey of Our Lady of the Holy Trinity in Hunstville.

1948-Saint Ambrose Parish and University of Utah Newman Center, Salt Lake City, Saint Rose of Lima in Layton, Saint Bridget Mission in Milford, established. **May 20:** Father Leo J. Steck is consecrated first auxiliary bishop of Salt Lake.

1949-Immaculate Conception Parish, formerly Holy Rosary Parish, moved to Copperton.

1950-Saint Henry Parish in Brigham City established. Divine Savior Parish in Salt Lake City renamed Sacred Heart Parish. **June 19:** Bishop Steck dies unexpectedly.

1951-By Papal decree the name Diocese of Salt Lake is officially changed to Diocese of Salt Lake City. Joseph Lennox Federal appointed Auxillary Bishop on **April 11, 1951**. Named Co-adjutor on May 8, 1958.

1952-August 5: Father Robert J. Dwyer, the first native priest to be ordained for the Diocese of Salt Lake City, is named Bishop of Reno and consecrated in The Cathedral of the Madeleine.

1953-Saint Christopher Parish in Kanab established.

1954-Saint Joseph Catholic High School opens in Ogden.

1955-Saint Francis of Assisi School opens in Provo. Saint Francis Xavier Parish in Kearns and Saint Pius X Parish in Moab established.

1956-Discalced Carmelite Nuns (Carmelites) arrive in diocese and later build Carmel of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Monastery in Holliday.

1957-Saint Mary Parish in Ogden established.

1958-Saint George Parish in St. George established.

1960—Saint Thomas Aquinas Parish in Logan established. New Judge Memorial Catholic High School Building completed. Our Lady of the Snows Center Station in Alta established. **March 31:** Bishop Duane G. Hunt dies and Bishop Joseph Lennox Federal becomes sixth bishop of the Diocese of Salt Lake City.

1961—Sacred Heart Mission in La Sal established.

1962—October 11 - December 13: Bishop Federal attends the opening of the Vatican Council II in Rome. He attends all sessions.

1964—Christ Prince of Peace HAFB Chapel at Hill Air Force Base established. Saint Ambrose Parish in Salt Lake City established. Saint Francis Xavier Elementary School in Kearns opens.

1966—Saint James the Just Parish in Ogden established. The annual Diocesan Development Drive is established.

1967—Saint Peter Mission (parish in 2000) in American Fork and Saint Dominic Mission in Bryce Canyon are established.

1968—Saint Ann Parish in Salt Lake City dedicated.

1969—Saint Joseph the Worker Parish in West Jordan established.

1971—Saint Jude Mission in Ephraim established. Saint Francis of Assisi School closes in Provo.

1972—Blessed Sacrament Parish in Sandy and Saints Peter and Paul Parish in West Valley City are established.

1973—Saint Marguerite church dedicated.

1974—Holy Family Mission in Fillmore begins with Mass in parishioners' homes. Saint Therese of the Child Jesus Parish dedicated after old church is destroyed by a fire. Weber State University Newman Center in Ogden established.

1975—The Restoration Program for the exterior of The Cathedral of the Madeleine is begun and completed in 1980. San Andres Mission in Payson established.

1976—Saint Vincent de Paul Parish moved from Murray to location on Spring Lane. Saint Jude (Maronite Rite) founded as a Mission in the old Saint Vincent de Paul Church in Murray. **September 26:** Bicentennials of the Dominguez-Escalante Expedition and the United States of America are celebrated with a Mass in the Salt Lake City Salt Palace, drawing 14,000 people. **December 26:** fourteen men are ordained permanent deacons.

1977—San Rafael Mission Huntington established; dedicated on Easter in **1978**.

1979—Holy Family Parish in South Ogden established.

1980—Saint Jude (Maronite Rite) named a parish. **April 22:** Bishop Federal resigns

and is succeeded by William K. Weigand, ordained seventh diocesan bishop on **November 17, 1980**, at the Salt Palace. **July 29:** Saint Olaf Church, Bountiful dedicated.

1981–Saint Thomas More Parish, Sandy established. University of Utah Newman Center renamed Saint Catherine of Siena/ Newman Center. Cosgriff Memorial Chapel in the Pastoral Center dedicated.

1982–A Lenten convocation, “Gathered in His Name,” draws 7,000 Catholics to the University of Utah Special Events Center. Saint Martin de Porres Parish in Taylorsville, Saint Michael Mission (becomes Saint Gertrude in 1989) in Panguitch, Saint Nicolas Mission (Blanding Station), Holy Spirit Mission in Duchesne, Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha Mission in Ft. Duchesne, are established.

1984–Saint Jude Center in Ephraim built. Saint Michael the Archangel Mission in Green River established. Saint Thomas More Parish in Sandy dedicated.

1985–San Isidro Mission in Elberta and San Felipe Mission (Parish in 2000) are established.

1986–Bishop Weigand participates in the preparation of the pastoral letter of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops regarding Catholic social teaching and the United States economy. Blessed Sacrament School opens. Beryl Junction (later San Pablo Mission) established. **April 27:** Saint Francis Xavier Parish in Kearns dedicated. **August 1:** Holy Family

Mission in Fillmore dedicated. **August 15:** San Andres Parish is established in Payson.

1990–September 16: Bishop Weigand dedicates Saint Florence Mission Huntsville.

1991–Saint Anthony of the Desert Mission in Torrey established. **April 14:** The diocese culminates a five-year celebration of its centennial with a Solemn Eucharistic Celebration at the University of Utah Special Events Center. **April 21:** Mission San Rafael in Huntington is dedicated.

1992–June 8: Saint Anthony of the Desert Mission in Torrey is dedicated. **August 28:** Blessing of the Saint Anne Center, Ogden, by Bishop Weigand. **November 17:** Saint Elizabeth Parish in Central Valley is dedicated.

1993–February 21, 22: The Cathedral of the Madeleine is reopened and rededicated after a six-year period of interior restoration overseen by Msgr. Francis M. Mannion. **November 21:** Saint Thomas More Parish in Sandy is dedicated. **November 30:** Bishop Weigand is named Bishop of Sacramento.

1994–January 27: Bishop Weigand is installed in Sacramento; Msgr. J. Terrence Fitzgerald is elected administrator of the Diocese of Salt Lake City. **March 27:** Establishment of Our Lady of the Snows Center, Alta. **June 13:** Sale of three Catholic Hospitals in Utah (Holy Cross, Salt Lake City, Holy Cross Jordan Valley

and Saint Benedict, Ogden) announced. Msgr. Fitzgerald dedicates the following: **June 15:** Blessing of the Social Hall, Saint Peter Mission, American Fork. **September 14:** Our Lady of Perpetual Help Vietnamese Catholic Center, Kearns. Rev. Thuy Dang Ha, Director. **September 18:** Saint Rose of Lima Church, Layton. Rev. Victor G. Bonnell, Pastor. **October 2:** Saint Jude Mission, Ephraim. Rev. Clarence J. Sandoval, Pastor. **October 7:** Holy Family Chapel, Catholic Community Services of Utah, SLC. Rev. Msgr. J. Terrence Fitzgerald, Executive Director.

1995–January 25: Msgr. George H. Niederauer is ordained eighth bishop of the Diocese of Salt Lake City in The Cathedral of the Madeleine. **December 15:** Bishop Niederauer dedicates the Saint Vincent de Paul Weigand Resource Center, SLC and on **December 18** the Saint George Parish Center and Grotto.

1996—Through the generosity of Sam and Aline Skaggs, the Skaggs Catholic Center is established on a 57-acre site in Draper, Utah. Design and construction of Juan Diego Catholic High School and Saint John the Baptist Elementary and Middle Schools begins. Saint John the Baptist Parish is established at the site, replacing the Mission. Blessing of the new wing, Saint Joseph Villa, Salt Lake City, by Bishop Niederauer. Sam and Aline Skaggs establish the Skaggs Family Foundation for Roman Catholic and Community Charities. **March 29:** Blessing of Holy Cross Ministries new facilities at 404 East 5600 South, SLC,

by Bishop Niederauer. **June 9:** Blessing of Eucharistic Chapel at Saint Lawrence Mission, Heber, by Bishop Niederauer.

1997–November 30: Sixteen men are ordained to the Permanent Diaconate. **June 5:** Blessing of windows, Cosgriff Memorial Chapel, Pastoral Center, by Bishop Niederauer. **August 15:** Dedication of the new Saint Mary of the Assumption Church, Park City, by Bishop Niederauer. Msgr. Robert J. Bussen, Pastor.

1998—Sam and Aline Skaggs donate their residence in Salt Lake City to the diocese to be used as the bishop's residence and for diocesan events.

1999—Centennials are celebrated by The Intermountain Catholic paper, Saint Joseph Church in Ogden, Kearns-Saint Ann School, and for The Cathedral of the Madeleine groundbreaking which took place on July 4, 1899. Saint John the Baptist (using Juan Diego Catholic High School auditorium) named a parish. Juan Diego Catholic High School and Saint John the Baptist Schools open, fall 1999. **April 15:** Blessing of Saint Sylvester Mission, Escalante, by Bishop Niederauer. Rev. Michael J. Winterer, Pastor. **September 17:** Bishop Niederauer blesses Chapel, Mount Benedict Monastery, Ogden. **September 26:** Blessing of Skaggs Catholic Center, Draper, by Bishop Niederauer. The Most Rev. William Levada, Archbishop of San Francisco., preached the homily.

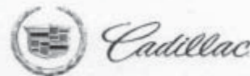
